

Who is Hrvatska elektroprivreda?

At the end of 2022, the total available power of power plants on the territory of the Republic of Croatia was 4,946.8 MW, of which 1,534.6 MW in thermal power plants, 2,203.4 MW in hydropower plants, 986.9 MW in wind power plants and 222.0 MW in solar power plants.

Does Croatia have geothermal power?

Croatia also has high potential in geothermal power, with six active exploration projects for electricity and heating plants in central and eastern Croatia. These regions, located in central Europe's Pannonian basin, have an average geothermal gradient 60% higher than the European average.
