Does Iran have a weapons program?

Weapons-grade levels of enrichment are around 90%. Since the collapse of Iran's 2015 nuclear deal with world powers following the U.S.' unilateral withdrawal from the accord in 2018,it has pursued nuclear enrichment just below weapons-grade levels. U.S. intelligence agencies and others assess that Iran has yet to begin a weapons program.

Is Iran a Muslim country?

With a multi-ethnic population of almost 90 million in an area of 1,648,195 km² (636,372 sq mi),Iran ranks 17th globally in both geographic size and population. It is the sixth-largest country entirely in Asia and one of the world's most mountainous countries. Officially an Islamic republic,Iran has a Muslim-majority population.
