Will there be a state of emergency in Moldova?

“As of December 16, a state of emergency will be in place throughout Moldova,” the Moldovan parliament said in a statement after the measure was approved by 56 of 101 MPs. The government said “insufficient energy resources that directly and immediately affect the security of the state and citizens” necessitated the state of emergency.

Why did Moldova suffer an energy crisis in 2022?

Moldova experienced an energy crisis in late 2022, which was the worst since its independence. The crisis was heavily influenced by the Russian invasion of Ukraine, causing Russia's Gazprom to reduce supplies.

Did energocom provide gas to Moldova?

During the energy crisis between December 2022 and March 2023, when Gazprom cut off supplies, Energocom provided all the gas needed by Moldova. ^a b Cojan, Liviu (25 October 2022).

Will the EU help Moldova deal with its energy crisis?

During a visit by the President of the European Commission Ursula von der Leyen to Moldova, a 250 million-euro financial package from the European Union (EU) was announced to help Moldova deal with its energy crisis. (Passage remains the same)

How did Russia resolve the Moldovan energy crisis?

The immediate crisis in Moldova was solved by financial help from the European Union, goodwill from Romania, and decisive action by Moldova after Russia cut the gas supply to Moldova completely. The Russian action led Moldova to decide to sever all connections to Russian energy sources and establish alternative supplies.

Who is the new energy minister of Moldova?

Following the restructuring of the Ministry of Infrastructure and Regional Development during the establishment of the Recean Cabinet on 16 February 2023, Victor Parlicov was appointed as the energy minister of Moldova.
