Does the Vatican have electricity?

As of 1 November 2005, all electric power was supplied by Italy, but the Vatican's generating plant had a capacity of 5,000 kW in 1990. A studio in the Vatican produces mosaic work, and a sewing establishment produces uniforms. There is a large printing plant, the Vatican Polyglot Press, which produces coins, medals, and postage stamps.

Is the Vatican spending \$660 million on Europe's largest solar power plant?

Last year Inhabitat reported that the Vatican was spending \$660 million on a massive 100MW photovoltaic installation that would effectively be Europe's largest solar power plant.

However, the city's solar installations, which include solar panels installed on the rooftop of Paul VI's conference hall, mean that the city can now generate enough energy to power all of its 40,000 households.

Pope Francis instituted a new law with the name of "Brother Sun" a reference to St Francis of Assisi, as he works toward making all the energy used by the Vatican City State, renewable and clean.. In this document, the pope orders the construction of an agrovoltaic plant in an extraterritorial area of the Vatican: Santa Maria di Galeria, about 20 miles northwest of Rome.

Agrivoltaics is a method which places solar panels above crops, allowing both solar energy and food to be produced simultaneously on the same land. The new plant aims to meet the energy requirements of Vatican Radio and contribute to "the complete energy sustenance of Vatican City State."

Additionally, the expansion of the electric vehicle charging network within the state territory and in extraterritorial areas is planned, extending its accessibility to the state's employees. Moreover, the Vatican is committed to ensuring that its energy needs are met solely through renewable energy sources.

The new plant aims to meet the energy requirements of Vatican Radio and contribute to "the complete energy sustenance of Vatican City State." The agrivoltaic plant will utilize the Holy See's property at Santa Maria di Galeria.
